Dear Church,

There is perhaps no greater loved Christmas Carol than "Silent Night." Every year it closes our Christmas Eve service while the sanctuary is bathed in light. It is a moving



experience and it wouldn't seem right if we had to do without it. It might surprise you that the melody of this carol was written in haste by Franz Gruber the night of Christmas Eve a few hours before it premiered in a humble church in Salzburg, Austria. The organ wasn't working at the time and it had to be accompanied on guitar. Neither Gruber nor the lyricist, Father Joseph Mohr, ever thought that the song would be performed outside of their own church. When the organ builder came to repair the organ, he was so enamored with the simple song that he brought it with him. Soon traveling folk singers were performing it until it was heard by the King of Prussia.

This year marks the 200th year after Silent Night debuted and it will frame all of our worship services in December leading up to and through Christmas. We are still going to be using our artwork we have been using but our traditional themes during Advent of Peace, Joy, Love and Hope will be presented in a different order to correspond to the verses of the carol. Our focus will be on our need for the light of God to guide us to the Good News coming into the world.

The word "Advent" has synonyms such as "arrival," "emergence," "surfacing," "dawn," "origin," "birth," "rise," "coming" and "approach." It is interesting that the last month of the year focuses on something that is beginning rather than ending, but I think that is appropriate to the way God works. When we think things are ending, God has something more in mind. Or to borrow what I hope is a familiar phrase to you - "Never place a period where God has placed a comma."

December is a huge comma in our lives; it's ok to look back, but we are encouraged to look forward with hope. As Christians, we can do that with confidence because we have seen the way God has worked in history.

We ended November with a story of devastation. In the exile, everything was wiped out and the people were taken to a foreign land. At first, it was thought of as the end of things for the Israelites but it really was the beginning of setting the stage for Jesus Christ's coming. It can be like that for us in modern days — an anticipation of something brand new in our lives if we are willing to allow God to draw near enough to us to make the difference God wants to make for us.

I want to take this opportunity to wish you and yours a very blessed holiday this year. Do allow yourselves to appreciate the time you have to be with loved ones. I encourage you to pray for those who are less fortunate and to go out of your way to be charitable to those who have lost so much. Maybe find someone who doesn't have close family members to share Christmas with and make them a part of your family celebrations in some way or contribute to our collections of food or gifts for needy children. In this way, we can demonstrate that the light of God can make a difference in the world. Let's reflect that light this Christmas.

Thanks to everyone at First UCC for their contributions in 2018 that support this special mission.


