#### "I Wanna Get Washed Up"

The first words in the 70's musical "Godspell" that Jesus says on stage are "I wanna get washed up." John the Baptist finds this odd as he does in scripture, but even more, the audience expects a much more profound thought from the Son of God than this childlike entrance. However, the unexpected is the rule when it comes to Jesus who enters ministry in a way that even the prophetic John the Baptist didn't see coming.

I admit that sometimes the New Year feels like just another day and a continuation of what has been happening. Sometimes we don't feel like change, especially if we are content. Change also takes some work. It's for this reason many times I don't make resolutions because I know that I will not be able to maintain ambitious goals. This year feels different for me though - I feel like change. I feel like "getting washed up" to start things on the right foot and nothing starts the day for me better than a good hot shower.

Baptism symbolizes a new beginning that washes away the old life and begins a new one. I like that we baptize infants as it blesses their life, their family's life and integrates them into a community of faith. But in being baptized as infants, one of the qualities we may lose perspective on is what baptism represents - change. Change is possible, friends. If we remembered our baptism, we might believe more readily in change.

In 2018, we began to do some things differently in the way we are organized and how we operate. This next year will be a test for us to see if we have the will to maintain these things, as I believe God is calling us to, or do we allow ourselves to naturally ease back into what was comfortable.

I believe that God wants to pour new wine into our souls, but if our vessels are old, we won't be able to hold it and we will burst.

Let's start the year off on the right foot and get washed up; ready to receive the new wine of God and to continue to change into the vessels that carry God's good news to a world that really needs it.

## Organ Repair Payoff


