

We apologize for the late date of this newsletter but with Ash Wednesday and the Dixieland service happening, we at the office have been behind the curve in getting things done. There are several things going on in our community

of faith that I want to talk about.

In December, I mentioned from the pulpit in a sermon that we ought to consider becoming an Open and Affirming congregation. As I explained, this is something that has been growing in my heart. We would be the first in our community to make a public statement that all people are welcome and safe here and that God loves all people the way they were created. At our latest Elders meeting we had a lengthy conversation about moving in this direction and I explained that I want to make sure that I follow through on proposals that I have made.

The recent vote by the United Methodist Church has brought this issue again to the forefront of the news. It's been since 1985 when the General Synod of the United Church of Christ passed a resolution calling on churches to consider becoming Open and Affirming. If you recall, it was in 2005 when the UCC passed a resolution in support of Marriage Equality. This unfortunately caused controversy in our congregation and many families decided to leave after this happened.

My goals for this calendar year are to have conversations about the possibility of adopting the Open and Affirming (OnA) designation. I'm not interested in forcing a vote immediately but only would like to facilitate education and communication in open dialogue. There is a plan in place to begin with a core team of people who would then begin one on one conversations with people in our congregation to talk about the issues involved, what the OnA designation means and why we feel it is important.

I encourage you to come to me with your thoughts and questions and we can sit down and talk. I have resources available that talk about biblical interpretation and the OnA process, should anyone want it.

In another matter, many of you are aware that our church was asked last year to host the annual meeting of the association. The meeting always happens on the last Saturday of April which means that it is the Saturday following Easter on April 27th. The March meeting of consistory will almost entirely be in discussion of this.

I saw dozens of children who were unaccompanied and had been recently released from a detention center. I heard many heartbreaking stories including one woman who was raped, gave birth while traveling through Mexico and was waiting under a bridge at the US border for three weeks before the ACLU got involved and sponsored her case for asylum. She and her beautiful baby girl are awaiting their court hearing in the United States, living safely at a shelter run by nuns.

The SW Good Samaritans are still run by its founder, Rev. Feliberto Pereira, who is himself a refugee from Cuba, arrested in the 1960s for being a Christian. He was held for almost three years before the United States was able to rescue him and others from horrendous circumstances. He is in his upper 80's, but you would never know it meeting and talking to him. (He helped me lift a 100-pound bag of rice into a van). In addition to being the head of this mission, he also pastors a church. I also spent a lot of time with Jimmy Mohler, a longtime volunteer from Missouri who was able to answer a lot of my questions and show me around. When I had time, I worked in their warehouse making personal care kits which we dropped off to missions. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this effort.

The week after I returned, our church sent 9 of us to North Street Mission in Wooster, Ohio that is run out of Trinity UCC there. We stayed overnight on Sunday and then on Monday we helped serve breakfast to people of the community. In the afternoon we helped put the primer coat on a Habitat for Humanity house in nearby Bellville. It was a very good time together and we learned a lot. For those of you on Facebook, you might have seen our pictures. We are planning another mission trip this summer in Cincinnati to Camp Washington, which is another mission run by a fellow UCC church. Stay tuned for more information about that, especially if you would like to go.

May your March be blessed my friends and during this Lent may God grow closer to you, as you grow closer to God.

We will have signups beginning this month. This is a big honor and responsibility for us, and we need an "all-hands on deck" approach.

Many of you asked about my trip to Texas last month. As it was not an official sabbatical, I didn't prepare a lengthy presentation like I did last year. I did, however, want to say that my time was interesting and very informative. For those of you that don't know, I spent five days in the Rio Grande valley of Texas volunteering and working with an organization called the Southwest Good Samaritans. This organization is supported through Our Church's Wider Mission offering and is under the umbrella of our sister denomination, the Disciples of Christ. The Rio Grande Valley is WAY down there in Texas, so it takes a long time to get there.

The organization's emphasis is to support refugees on both sides of the border with basic needs. They have a VERY large campus with the potential to house over a hundred people. Currently due to staff limitations, they house 25 people who are awaiting their court date in the United States for asylum due to credible threats to their lives in their countries of origin. Most of these people have been in one of the detention facilities in the area before being released. As I expected, most were from Central America who hiked over a thousand miles through Mexico. To my surprise, there were also people housed there that are from Asia, Africa and Cuba who made their way to South America on a plane flight and hiked many months from there in order to apply for asylum here.

The organization also partners with Catholic Charity missions and a United Methodist Mission in Brownsville collecting supplies for the refugees and dropping them off once a week. They help detainees in securing legal representation, make trips across the border to help those waiting at legal ports of entry and help with bus tickets for those with family members willing to sponsor them in the United States while they await their court hearings. This organization operates very differently from the Green Valley Samaritans whom I visited last year. The GV Samaritans emphasis is helping migrants crossing in the desert and setting out water so that people don't die from dehydration, which thousands have. I also learned on this trip that the Mexican states that are across the border from the Rio Grande Valley are heavily corrupt from cartel influence and not safe, so I did not visit Mexico as I did last year while in Arizona.
