Consistory Highlights

Pastor Harvey reported a new member, Todd Knight, joined the church on Oct. 13th. Larry Nigh is taking a leave of absence from the visitation ministry. A Vision Retreat is set for Jan. 11, 2020 to determine goals for the year and beyond. The annual church meeting was set for Jan. 26, 2020.

The Trustees reported the shrubbery has been trimmed with an exterior clean-up Saturday to take place in Nov. Estimates are being sought for a replacement of an outdoor church sign.

The finance report reflects an increase in last month's giving, moving the church from 93% to 98% of the annual budget.

The Mission Committee will sponsor the "Hills are Alive" campaign again in 2020 (renovation of Pilgrim Hills Camp).

The monthly Fellowship and Outreach meals are growing in attendance. Upcoming missions will include the Thanksgiving/Back Bay dinner Nov. 17 and "Come Home to Galion" turkey soup served on the Square uptown on Dec. 7.

A committee of retiring Consistory members: Nancy Green, Alan Forry, Rose Crago-Roach and Todd Rudolph, is working on finding church members to fill openings on Consistory for 2020.

A new committee, Communication/Organization/Planning (COP) has met twice, under the leadership of Doug and Mary Ann Stone, to review how the church communicates information internally and to the outside community. They have been collecting updated member contact information.

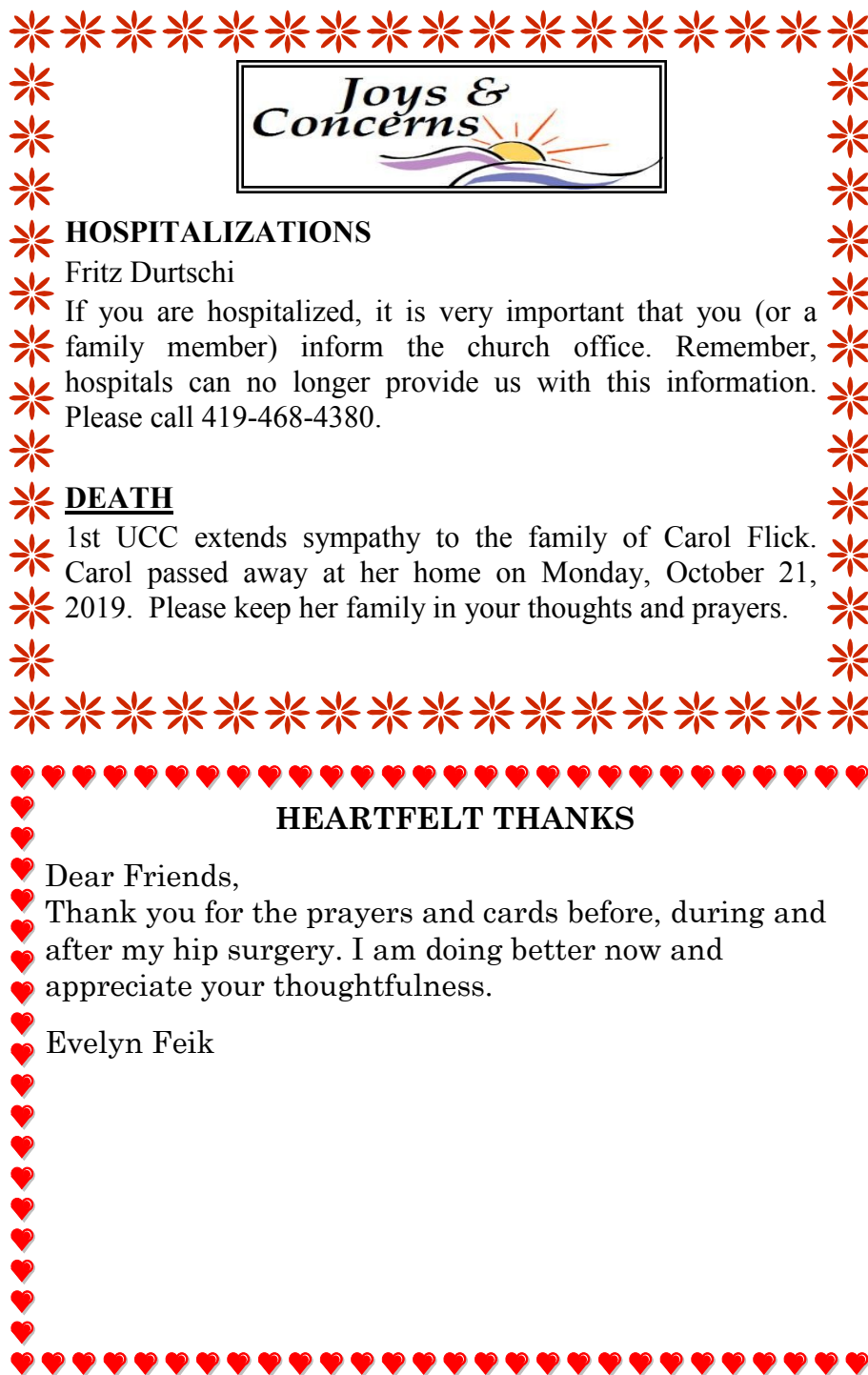

Consistory? What's that?

Consistory is the executive body of the church and consists of the Pastor, four Elders, six Deacons, and four Trustees. There is also a secretary of the Consistory, appointed by the Consistory, who also serves as the secretary of the congregation. This person does not vote on any matters. The Consistory meets once a month and any other time a special meeting may be necessary.


The Elders, who are elected to serve a four-year term, along with the Pastoral Staff constitute the "Spiritual Council" of the church. Among their duties are to assist the pastor in planning and ministering to the spiritual needs of the faith community. This includes overseeing Pastoral Care, Worship, Evangelism, Fellowship, Mission and Christian Education. The Elders also prepare and serve communion at least once a month and at other special times in the church year. They may also occasionally be asked to assist in home communion visits, visit shut-ins by themselves when the pastoral staff is unable to, assist in worship or be available in an emergency situation when the pastor is ill or away. The Senior Elder conducts the Consistory meetings.

The Deacons, who are elected to serve a three-year term, oversee ushering at Sunday morning services and whenever special services are held, light the candles before the service, if there is no acolyte that day, ring the tower bell at 10 am when the service begins and gather the offering during church services. They make sure the lights are on before the service and put the flowers on the altar. The setup and tearing down of the coffee and cookie stand in the hallway is also one of their duties. When there is communion, they help the Elders distribute the elements.

The Trustees, who are elected to serve a four-year term, are responsible for the physical property of the church which includes the building, parking lot and land owned by the church. They are responsible for maintenance issues when things fail to function and for the upkeep of the building and grounds. After Sunday worship, a trustee makes sure that doors are locked, windows are closed and the lights are off. When there is snow, a trustee cleans the sidewalk, as needed, before the morning worship service. Trustees may organize work days or clean up days, as needed, to help maintain the building and grounds. The Senior Trustee serves as the "President" of the congregation at the annual meeting and is a contact person for legal agreements.

The Elders, Deacons and Trustees are elected by the congregation at a meeting held in January. All elections for officers shall be by ballot and by a majority of the members present and voting in an authorized congregational meeting. The people elected begin their terms at the close of the annual meeting of the congregation.

PUMPKIN DUMP CAKE

1 can (15oz) pumpkin puree (not pie mix)

1 can (12oz) evaporated milk

3 eggs

1 cup sugar

1tsp cinnamon

1 box spice cake mix

1 cup melted butter

Spray a 9x13 pan and preheat oven to 350 degrees.

In a medium bowl combine pumpkin, milk, eggs, sugar & cinnamon until well combined. (It will be liquified). Pour this mixture into the greased pan. Sprinkle cake mix on top of mixture. Take melted butter and drizzle over the top.

Bake for 55-60 minutes. It might still be a little jiggly in the middle when done. It will continue to set as it cools.

Let cool for at least 30 minutes. Top with whipped cream.

Refrigerate leftovers. They can be heated in microwave to serve warm.

**Fairhaven Community
Volunteer Service Group Newsletter
October 21, 2019**

The meeting was called to order by President Barb Nigh.
Devotions were given by Galion First.
Roll Call: Volunteers – 19, Staff – 3
Minutes of previous meeting stood approved as read.
Treasury - \$5,780.82
Gift Shop - \$3,490.75
Bingo Cup - \$17.00

VSG Business:

Tree of Love forms made available to all present. Forms need to be returned by November 18th meeting to be included in dedication booklet. Dedication of Tree of Love to take place November 25th at 1pm. Discussion of whether or not to hold the annual carnival next year was discussed. It was decided that the residents prefer bingo. Therefore, a motion was made and carried to discontinue the carnival in 2020. A recap of Harvest Fest was given and the changes made were critiqued. More changes will probably be done next year to fine tune the event but it was definitely a success. As of this point, with a check or two still outstanding, the profit is approximately \$4,500.00 which is an increase of \$1,500.00 from the prior year. A suggestion was made to incorporate the “Treasures Old & New” (which was not included in Harvest Fest this year) with the Bake Sale in 2020. This will be discussed more at a later date. It was shared that Phyllis Diederich, a long-time VSG member, passed recently. Memorials were made to VSG of Fairhaven as requested at her funeral. When these are received, the group will make a decision how to utilize these as a memorial in her name.

Staff:

Becky King informed all that OMA is starting again this week. November 3rd will be the Memorial Service. And The Giving Tree is for Music and Memory this month. Also, Administrator Lori Marsh's last day was October 4th as she has taken a position elsewhere. Alissa Clouse passed out a copy of the current “Wish List.” When asked by one volunteer why more of these items aren't furnished by Fairhaven, Alissa explained that 72% of the residents are on Medicaid which causes a daily deficit. Last year Fairhaven lost \$2.5 million in charity care. A committee is being started to talk about how to offset this in early 2020.

Becky Blocksom summed up the meeting by reminding all that “The giant in front of you is never bigger than the God inside of you.” She then led the group in “The Way” and closed the meeting with prayer.

The next meeting will be November 18th with a potluck following the meeting. Devotion will be given by Bucyrus St. John's and Tree of Love forms will be due. Decoration of Fairhaven for Christmas will be November 25th at 10am. Those who signed up to furnish pies for the residents following bingo are: Marcy Miller, Marlene McDaniels, Carol Moran, Lydia Guthrie and Arlene Main.
