Your voice has been heard and your contribution has been important.

The more difficult question we have now is "what is next?". It's one thing to have words but a more difficult thing to live out our mission. I'm delighted to report that we have already begun action steps towards living into our mission more fully. We have identified six needs to address in our church that Consistory has identified.

- 2) Attendance

- 6) Ministry to young people.

I believe that we can look forward to not only a great year but a great few years in our church as we become more of what God wants us to be in Galion. I ask that you would pray for our leadership that the Spirit might continue to guide and inspire us to increase our reach with the Good News.


GENESIS FRIENDS
