As we begin May, we are anxious to be back to normal both in our lives and in our church life. Sadly, we know that it will be several more weeks as we face a slow return to normal. In the meantime, we have made the transition to an online community fairly well and many are getting used to our practice of being on Facebook. For those of you more at risk, know that we plan on continuing with online worship as we transition back to meeting in person. While it's not ideal, we have made the most out of it and have even been able to use it to our advantage in what we can include in worship and who we can reach. Thank you to everyone who has had a hand in making this possible, especially the Stones for their work. It's good to at least see a lot of faces on Sunday morning since we can't see each other face to face.

A huge thank you to those who have continued to support our ministry and mission. We are continuing to do our best to help people get through this. Adair is able to be back to work after being quarantined so we will be able to send out worship packets to those without internet access in May. Many of you are continuing to call a few people during the week to check up on them and we greatly appreciate that. One of our goals for May is to have our monthly community meal as a carry out event. We are making plans on this and looking forward to again helping those in need on May 21st. Thanks to Rhonda Harvey and Chris Coe, we have been able to give away many masks to our members, to the hospital and to the local health department. If you need a mask, let us know and we would be happy to provide one for you now that it is required for us in public spaces to have one on. Using technology, we have been able to continue our business meetings as needed and even to plan social virtual hangouts with our youth.

As we did at Easter will be taking orders for geraniums. You can fill out a form and send it into us. We will have these on display on Pentecost Sunday on May 31st.

As a church, I feel we have been there for each other. As we hear in the media and on commercials, we are in this together. But as I look beyond our faith community, I wonder if this statement is really true as I find that this disease has exacerbated inequality and division in our country. At the beginning of the crisis we saw how the rich and famous were able to get tested while most people were not. As people began then to lose their jobs, we saw how some people were able to work from home and some were not effectively losing their income. As people begin to get their stimulus checks we see how some that don't need it get it and others who desperately need it don't. We have seen our cities and urban populations decimated with this illness while small towns and rural places have relatively few cases. In other words, many of us are in very different circumstances.



Hello church! During the Covid-19 shut down, the finance committee has met every two weeks by video conference. We have done this to keep the elders and consistory apprised of our financial situation, so they can make informed decisions. Historically, we know that closing the church for a single Sunday for inclement weather can adversely affect the entire year's budget. We had no idea what would happen when the church was closed indefinitely.

Last month, I reported we were running about 92% of budgeted giving in a year over year comparison. This month, I am pleased to report we have only fallen to about 85% of budgeted giving. So many who are in a position to give have continued to send in offering envelopes or have given through our on line portal. The committee would like to extend a hearty THANK YOU!





- *Consistory Meeting was held virtually by live streaming or phone.
- *All Committee Meetings have been conducted on line or by phone.
- *Weekly events will be handled on a week-by-week basis depending on what the Governor says.
- *All flowers and masks were handed out on Monday and Thursday after Easter.
- *Services, if deemed cannot be in person, will be live on YouTube and Facebook at 10 AM.

- *Senior recognition has been postponed with the closing of schools for the rest of the year. Plans are in the works to someway recognize the seniors.
