"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." John 14:27 NRSV

When Jesus left the disciples and went to heaven it, of course, marked a new era in the movement. It took some time before they accepted it and got used to doing things differently. The message was the same though: "The Kingdom of Heaven is upon you."

For most of this year, we have had to change things on the fly and be adaptable but the time has come to once again look to our future and work towards it. At the beginning of the year, which seems like such a long time ago now, we spent our retreat talking about our mission and purpose. We promised that these things would not just be empty words so, we identified areas that we would like to work on and pledged to discuss these things in Consistory and all of our other team meetings, as it was relevant and have clear action plans before our next meeting.

Then in mid March COVID happened and that has dominated our time and energy since. We have spent a great deal of energy in our online broadcast and invested in new equipment to meet our needs and goals. Therefore, I encourage you to check out our internet offerings as much as possible. On Tuesdays I'm offering sessions taken from the "Living the Questions" curriculum and on Wednesdays I'm offering some excerpts of Henri Nouwen's book "Reaching Out" as a part of our prayer service. Our home worship packets will continue as well to those not able to get to worship and lacking an internet connection. The time has come for us to consider what our church will look like in a year. These challenges that we face now offer an opportunity to grow and evolve. Churches cannot afford to ignore their mission and purpose, otherwise they run the risk of becoming stagnant and withering on the vine. When Christ ascended into heaven many Christians expected his return within their lifetimes. When this didn't happen they were forced to take the long view of things.

We are once again going to be considering the long view of things in our meeting agendas as we seek to welcome, love and serve all. Please continue to pray for our church and to pray especially for those on our prayer list as we have had a great deal happen the past few months to many of our members.

SLOW COOKER CHEESY POTATO SOUP

1 block of cream cheese	32 oz. chicken broth
1 can cream of chicken soup	1 bag 32 oz. hash browns
1 chicken bouillon cube	3 cups grated cheddar cheese
1/2 C. bacon bits	Salt & Pepper

Cube up a softened block of cream cheese (set aside). Add chicken broth & cream of chicken soup to slow cooker. Whisk. Stir in cubed cream cheese, add bouillon cube, add hash browns, 3 cups grated cheddar cheese & 1/2 cup bacon bits. Stir.

Cover & cook on high for 3 1/2 hours stirring often.

Add salt & pepper to taste. Top with additional cheese & bacon bits.

FAIRHAVEN HARVEST FESTIVAL

Well, it's that time of year but, as you all know, we will not be able to hold the Harvest Festival as in the past. And, as you all know, this is our big money maker for the Volunteer Service Group to be able to assist the Fairhaven residents.

Last year we were able to net \$4,070.33 from the festival with additional donations of \$550.00 for a total of \$4,620.33. With this money we were able to donate to the resident's specialized program and purchase arts and crafts supplies, new curtains and blinds totaling \$4,000.00. And I'm sure we would have donated our normal \$1,000.00 to the Scholarship Fund this spring, like always, with money we would have made from our normal bake sale and other miscellaneous fund. However, this year none of that is happening. Therefore, we would like to present you with an alternative. If each of you, along with your church group, would donate, at a minimum, the money that you would normally have spent at the festival, that would be nice. That would include the cost of the food items you donated for the meal, the cost of the baked goods you donated for the bake sale, the money you would normally have spent at the festival for the meal and any other items you purchase. I don't know that we will be able to equal what we made last year, but whatever we are able to collect will then be passed on by the Volunteer Service Group to help the residents of Fairhaven.

I believe most of us are in a much better position than the residents at Fairhaven as they try to contend with the restrictions forced on them by the covid pandemic. Most of them are restricted to their rooms with no freedom to go anywhere. So please look into your hearts and give as much as you can spare so that we can continue to support the residents at this time.
