

If there ever is a time for hope, peace, joy (at least a little) and love it is now. May God bless you and keep you and may God's face shine on you and give you peace now and forever more. God is with us.



President Barb Nigh called the meeting to order.

VSG Business:

By-Laws have been located. Last revised 2013. They state that President Term is 2 years and then Vice President should advance to position. 2 year term is not mandatory. Also states that first \$1,000 received from special events goes to Life Enrichment Fund. These things can be changed but consensus to table until such time as more members are able to attend meeting.

Officer election results – all officers agreed to serve another vear.

Scholarship – It was agreed that due to the pandemic and limited funds, the scholarship this year would be \$500 instead of \$1,000.

The audit committee is Becky Blocksom and Arlene Main. They will make arrangements to look at books.

Christmas tree decorating at Fairhaven will be done by staff as 3 staff have tested positive for covid and no visitation is allowed.

Tree of Love dedication will be done by Pastor Becky by Zoom. All who donated will be contacted to "attend" after Pastor Becky sets the date and time for the dedication. As of this date, \$379 has been received.



A picture of Phyllis Diederich, as part of her memorial, will be hung in gift shop once it is open again. \$505 has been received with the designation of something being purchased for the chapel at Fairhaven as a memorial for Ruth Adams. Pastor Becky will decide on the item and let the group know what has been selected.

It was decided to hold the next VSG meeting December 14th at 10:30 at Emmanuel UCC church. The purpose of the meeting will be to fill stockings for residents for Christmas. There will be no business meeting as do not expect many to attend. It was agreed by those present to cancel the January meeting.

Whether or not the February meeting will be held will be decided as we get closer to that date.

Thank you cards for those who donated to Harvest Fest were prepared by the group. A total of \$2,460 has been received at this time.

Booklets for 2021 will be done by the February meeting date and will just duplicate the monthly assignments from 2020. These can be changed as needed once regular meetings commence in 2021. Also, it was agreed to list the volunteers alphabetically instead of by church affiliation for easier lookup. Church affiliation will be listed with each member's information along with email address, if known.

Staff:

Alissa Clouse shared that fund raising is going well. Employee giving this year is at 85% participation, a 10% increase from the prior year. The special project is for a gazebo for the front yard at Fairhaven. Also, there are 2 new funds, the Covid Relief Fund for United Church Homes and Employee Emergency Fund. She has applied to Elks for \$2,000 toward the gazebo and is working on year end appeal.

The meeting was closed with "The Way" and prayer.

Report from the Finance Committee

As we get close to the end of the year, we continue to monitor weekly giving vs. budget. We will be meeting virtually in December.

The year over year giving comparison is:

2019 \$119,000 **2020** \$115,123

A decision regarding the use of budgeted reserve funds will be made at our December meeting. We are projecting we will end the year at approximately 92% of the budgeted giving amount. We will also finalize the 2021 budget in December for presentation to the congregation in January.

Despite giving being down, we feel very blessed to be in the position we are going into the end of the year. Our members continued to faithfully give during the upheaval in the world this year. In addition, careful planning in past years has allowed us to better weather this storm. To our congregation, thank you again for your financial support.


While we are not worshiping in person, offering envelopes can be mailed and the church office is staffed daily. As a reminder, on line giving is available and instructions are provided on another page.
