The founder of Methodism, John Wesley, was known for highlighting "The Covenant Renewal Service" usually held on New Year's Day around England. At the heart of the service, people recited "The Covenant Prayer" in which people would publicly commit or recommit their lives to God.

New Year's offers us a chance to take on these two traditions equally – to humbly repent and to celebrate our freedom. This past year of all years, we have learned the dangers of pride, division and selfishness. Once COVID begins to subside, the New Year promises to be one where we can once again enjoy the fullness of life we have sorely missed; this will be cause to celebrate, for sure. But let us first recommit ourselves to the cause of Christ with these hymn lyrics written by Charles Wesley with New Year's in mind.

- 1. Come, let us use the grace divine, and all with one accord, in a perpetual covenant join ourselves to Christ the Lord; Give up ourselves, thru Jesus' power, his name to glorify; and promise, in this sacred hour, for God to live and die.
- 2. The covenant we this moment make be ever kept in mind; we will no more our God forsake, or cast these words behind. We never will throw off the fear of God who hears our vow; and if thou art well pleased to hear, come down and meet us now.

3. Thee, Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, let all our hearts receive, present with thy celestial host the peaceful answer give; to each covenant the blood apply which takes our sins away, and register our names on high and keep us to that day!






### Organ Repair Payoff

### ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

Our January mission is One Great Hour of Sharing. I have included a story of just how important this offering has helped folks in need.

Sarah, a young mother, was faced with an incredible challenge: her nine-month-old daughter couldn't consume solid foods- or any food for that matter-and as a result, the child wasn't growing adequately. Willing to try anything, Sarah would feed her daughter new foods in the hope that her daughter's body would finally accept some type of nourishment. Time and time again her hopes were dashed. Enter WIC on Wheels of Lancaster, PA., a program sponsored by the Pennsylvania Department of Health. The mobile clinic brings the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children directly to communities and offers services such as healthy foods, nutrition education and healthcare referrals. The mobile clinic has been a godsend for Sarah and her daughter. It was there that Sarah was given a voucher to purchase Elecare, a lifesaving formula for her daughter. Sarah's daughter has gained strength, and her sensitive stomach has become more agreeable to some foods with the help of the mobile clinic's nutritionist. This is one of the stories of impact provided by Bread for the World. One Great Hour of Sharing has been a long-time supporter of Bread for the World and its mission to end hunger.

### **Cheesy Chicken Chowder**

- 2 (14 oz) cans of Chicken Broth
- 2 C. diced and peeled Potatoes
- 1 C. diced Carrots
- 1 C. diced Celery
- ½ C. diced Onion
- 1 tea. Salt
- ½ tea. Pepper
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> C. Butter
- 1/3 C. Flour
- 1 C. 2% Milk
- 1 C. shredded Cheddar Cheese
- 1 C. diced cooked Chicken (leftover rotisserie Chicken works out great)
- 1. Bring chicken broth to a boil in a large sauce pan. Reduce heat. Add potatoes, carrots, celery, onion, salt and pepper. Cover and simmer until vegetables are tender, about 15 minutes.
- 2. Melt butter in a medium sauce pan. Add flour and mix well. Gradually stir in milk and cook over low heat. Add cheese and cook until melted. Add cheese mixture to broth and vegetables along with chicken. Cook and stir over low heat until thoroughly heated. Serves 8

### FIRST UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST, GALION, OHIO ANNUAL MEETING, JANUARY 26, 2020

Trustee Kevin Cotsmire called the meeting to order at 11:00 AM. The agenda, budget, financial report, minutes and ballots were distributed to all in attendance. Annual reports were distributed to those requesting. Pastor Darrin Harvey gave the opening prayer.

Brian Treisch moved to accept the agenda with the addition of a presentation of and vote on a Vision and Mission Statement. Ken Green seconded the motion. MC

Adair Pittman moved, with Rose Crago-Roach seconding, to approve the minutes of the January 27, 2019 Annual Meeting as printed. MC Finance Committee Chairperson Stacey Hocker was invited to the podium to review the 2019 Financial Report. Stacey thanked all who are on the Finance Committee and gave special thanks to Mary Ann Stone for all she does. The committee report opened with a special note that lots has been happening in the financial area. Giving is down, partly attributed to a lot of deaths in the congregation. The 2019 financial report begins on page 15 of the attached agenda packet. All of the reserve funds of \$20,000.00 were used last year and were budgeted for 2020. Therefore 2020 is starting with a healthy balance. It is realized all of the reserve funds cannot be used every year. We are blessed with 24% of our income coming from reusable income sources. The 2020 budget is presented on the blue sheet in the agenda packet (attached). Compared to 2019 both expenses and income are down. Noted were two large decreases: a savings of \$7000.00 on natural gas and a \$2000.00 savings on building insurance. Noted is a small adjustment in staff salaries. One salary was removed and additional items for staff are line items. Once again, Stacey noted the reserves cannot be used every year.

Doug Court explained the Endowment Funds. He noted the Endowment Committee now has three members with the addition of Sandy Powell and Keith Eichhorn. The Endowment grew in 2019 due to the increase in the Stock Market. Due to the \$27,000.00 increase in endowment earnings in 2019, much more than anticipated, the Consistory will be asked at the February meeting to approve moving \$30,000.00 to the Reserve Fund. The move will keep the Endowment Fund as is and transfer the surplus. Doug noted the earnings fund received another undesignated bequest from the estate of Barb Thompson.

Because it is undesignated, some moneys will be distributed to various places as needed. Ken Green moved to adopt the 2019 Financial Budget as presented. Greg Russell seconded the motion. MC

Kevin Cotsmire asked for a motion to adopt the 2020 Budget as presented, noting vote would be taken by a paper ballot, which is attached to the agenda packet. Rose Crago-Roach moved, with Larry Ness seconding, to adopt the budget with no changes. The congregation was asked to mark their ballots. Elder Nancy Green presented the nominations for Consistory, asking them to stand as they were introduced. Elder: Judy Eichhorn; Deacons: Barb Koschnick and Mary Ann Stone; Trustee, Todd Rudolph. Nominations were asked for from the floor. Brian Treisch moved to close the nominations. Mike Swick seconded the motion. MC The congregation was asked to mark their ballots.

Pastor Harvey gave an update on the Vision Retreat held Saturday, January 11, 2019. Sixteen (16) members attended to plan the future for the church. Those in attendance developed an updated Mission and Vision statement. The statements were presented to the Consistory, voted on as amended and accepted pending approval of the congregation at the annual meeting. The statements presented on the screen were: Vision: "Galion UC of Christ envisions a community that is caring, sharing and belonging;" Mission: "United in the Joy of Christ we welcome, love and serve all."

It was noted the Vision Statement presented by the Consistory was "Galion First UCC envisions a community that is caring, sharing and belonging". Brian Treisch moved to accept the Mission Statement and the Vision Statement with the change as presented by Consistory. Bill Shifley seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Pastor Darrin Harvey thanked the outgoing Consistory Members: Elder, Nancy Green; Trustee, Alan Forry; Deacons: Rose Crago-Roach and Todd Rudolph and presented them with a gift.

Kevin Cotsmire asked if anyone had anything else to come before the congregation.

Todd Knight felt the behind the scenes people such as the people involved with the sound, the cleaning, the secretary, and everyone else who helps the church run smoothly need to be thanked.

Brian Treisch announced that action groups would be formed by the Consistory next month to carry out the Vision and Mission Statements. Pastor Harvey added that six areas have been addressed to work on. Ballots were collected.

Lisa Eichhorn moved to adjourn the meeting. Maggie Sulser seconded the motion. MC.

Pastor Darrin offered a blessing of the meeting and the Spaghetti Dinner to follow.

### **Report from the Finance Committee**

As we get close to the end of the year, we continue to monitor weekly giving vs. budget. We met virtually in December. At that meeting, the 2021 budget was finalized for presentation to Consistory.

The year over year giving comparison as of December 27 is:

**2019** \$136,408 **2020** \$132,635

We are projecting we will end the year at approximately 91% of the budgeted giving amount. Not having an in-person Christmas Eve service had an impact on end of year giving, but we feel very fortunate to be in the position we are in during these uncertain times.

Our members have continued to faithfully give this year. We have been able to meet our financial obligations. Some expenses decreased slightly due to not holding in-person worship for much of the year. In addition, the Finance Committee reviews expenses and seeks ways to save on costs throughout the year. While some reserve funds will be transferred before the end of the year, we did not have to use the full amount that was budgeted in January.

To our congregation, thank you for your continued financial support.

While we are not worshiping in person, offering envelopes can be mailed and the church office is staffed daily. As a reminder, on line giving is available and instructions are provided on another page.

Thank you to everyone for your continued support of the missions and programs of First UCC.
