Organ Repair Payoff Exciting News!

Consistory voted, at its February meeting, to free up \$14,500 of its reserves to pay half of the loan principle. With the over \$87,500 that has been donated through April 1, 2021, the balance due on the loan is now down to \$10,750.

This money will then be used for other maintenance related costs.

Report from the Finance Committee

As we end the first quarter, our year-to-date envelope and online giving is \$35,221.73. As our budgeted giving amount for 2021 is \$140,000, we are exactly where we should be at 25% of annual giving.

What a difference a year makes. Last year at this time our building was closed due to Covid restrictions. Giving was down as we adjusted to worshipping virtually. As previously reported, our members continued to faithfully give throughout the challenges of 2020 and the first quarter of this year.

We are blessed to be able to worship in person on a limited basis. The church continues to reach people beyond our walls through online worship. As restrictions ease, we are hopeful we can expand our missions and outreach over what was possible last year.

The finance committee continues to monitor giving and expenses on a monthly basis. We strive to find ways to reduce expenses to better support the programs of the church. As approved at the annual meeting in January, the 2021 budget includes the use of \$20,000 in reserve funds. As the year progresses, if giving keeps pace with budget, it becomes possible to imagine that we may be able to use less than the amount budgeted from reserves.

If you are unable to join us for worship in person, we would like to remind everyone that online giving is available, and instructions are provided on another page.
