While the UCC General Synod was held virtually, that did not prevent the body from doing the work of the denomination. Rev. John Dornhauer, our UCC President, said in his state of the church address, the past 17 months of pandemic have been exhausting in the church as church leaders, ordained ministers, staff, and parishioners are carrying untold grief, loss, and burdens of stress. Yet our mission is still striving in the midst. As the pandemic spread and churches halted in person worship the national body, the regional conferences, the area associations, and the individual congregations of the church planned and braced for organizational disaster. Instead of disaster the church experienced adaptations and meaningful changes in ways that allowed attendance to rebound, finances to remain steady, and new avenues of worship and service to develop. It is a reminder of Rev. Dornhauer's belief, shared when he accepted the presidency 6 years ago, that the Holy Spirit envisions a world in which we matter. We as individuals and we as the church universal matter.

At Synod the delegates and guests worship, keynote speakers inspire, and committees report. In the committee reports we know that our main offices will be moving to a smaller location in Cleveland, as we are selling the 9 story century old building to avoid remodeling cost and empty rooms. The new manual of worship and a new book of worship, called for in past Synods, is in the editing stages and will be published soon. The newly formed Center for Analytics, Research & Development, and Data is actively using the data congregations send for the annual yearbook and providing real demographics to guide decision making. And more....

Of course, there are the resolutions calling for action and directing the national office. A list of the titles is included later in this newsletter. I will be leading discussions of these during the Sunday School hour beginning August 22.

- 7. Becoming a church of contemplatives in action
- 8. A resolution to declare and respond to racism as a public health crisis
- 9. A resolution to recognize the United Nations International Decade for People of African Descent (2015-2024)
- 10. A resolution on protecting workers at churches and other religious institutions


