THE INTERIM PASTOR'S NOTEBOOK:

Pentecost calls us to the upward, outward and inward journeys

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Easter, and now Pentecost, marks the real beginning, rather than the ending of the story of Christianity.

For the Disciples, Pentecost meant resuming the Jesus journey, but in a completely new and transformative way.

For us at First United Church of Christ, perhaps this Easter, and now Pentecost season, can also be a hinge moment as we again this year resume our journey of faith as a congregation and as individuals.

Perhaps as we reflect on these holidays, we can move forward with Jesus, positively, in a new and transformative way.

Then at Pentecost, all the fear and timidity was gone and they broke out into the world with a transformative message about times of refreshment for all people. The Disciples moved from their everyday lower-room experience, back to an upper-room experience with Jesus.

Then the message and ministry of Jesus just exploded into the world.

So this Pentecost season, 2022, I want to recommend a similar personal and group move from the lower-room congregational and personal experience to the upper room-congregational and personal experience with Jesus.

The lower-room experience settles for a defacto emphasis on place (usually a church building), personality (usually, but not always the pastor's), people (my friends) and programs. (In this lower-room description, I am indebted to material from church growth expert Will Mancini.)

In contrast, the upper-room experience involves a completely transformative and ongoing encounter with the risen Christ.

One way to kick it up to more of a transformative and exciting upper-room experience with Jesus might involve focusing on one or more of our three key Christian journeys.

The first is the upward journey. This involves moving toward a closer walk with God, mediated by Jesus Christ. The second is the outward journey.

THE INTERIM PASTOR'S NOTEBOOK: (con't)

This involves moving toward our neighbors – other people in a constructive, reconciling and positive way, mediated by Jesus Christ. The third involves the inward journey. This involves moving toward personal and spiritual healing of the self, mediated by Jesus Christ. In each of these personal Christian journeys, the key is the mediation by Jesus Christ himself.

We might wish to pray about which of these three Christian journeys Jesus might be calling us to stress right now, this Pentecost season.

Do we most need to strengthen our relationship with God? Or is our weakest Christian journey right now our relationship with other people – including family members and spouses, neighbors and fellow church members? Or do we have personal or spiritual wounds where we need inner healing to come from God, in order that we might better relate to God and others?

At this Pentecost, we celebrate God pouring his life-changing Holy Spirit on all people to perform great personal, congregational and global wonders.

All who believe will be stretched by the Spirit – as we journey with Jesus -- seeing visions of God's future for us, dreaming dreams of what God yet has in store for each of us, for our congregation and for our world.
