Friday 9:00 a.m. ~ 12:00 p.m. The four weeks of Advent leading up to Christmas are an invitation - an invitation to see the world, and our place in it, with new and renewed vision. To see the world through the lenses of hope, peace, joy and love.

In some ways, this special time is an invitation to get into the Christmas spirit, watch movies and sing songs we love, count down the days to the grand celebration and let the holiday transform everything around us. It is a time when our homes and our church family work extra hard to be at our best.

In some ways, this is also a time of increased awareness that our home and our church family is not the perfect family we imagine it should be. Even when we do our best, we realize that we fall short of the family or community we celebrate. The stories we read in the Bible are wonderful but they seem a little too good to be true.

And yet, here it is. God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong.

These coming weeks, I invite you to "come home for Christmas" - physically, if able, and especially spiritually. Join with us in remembering what matters most. As we read the "Good News of Great Joy" the angels proclaim, we recognize that God has become personally involved in our messy and sin filled lives through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. The Gospel of Luke reminds us time and time again that God offers the chance for less than perfect people to become more than ever thought or imagined.

Eugene H. Peterson conveys this well in <u>The Message</u> when he writes in his introduction to Luke:

---

Most of us, most of the time, feel left out -- misfits. We don't belong. Others seem to be so confident, so sure of themselves, "insiders" who know the ropes, old hands in a club from which we are excluded.

One of the ways we have of responding to this is to form our own club, or join one that will have us. Here is at least one place where we are "in" and the others "out."

The clubs range from informal to formal in gatherings that are variously political, social, cultural, and economic. But the one thing they have in common is the principle of exclusion. Identity or worth is achieved by excluding all but the chosen. The terrible price we pay for keeping all those other people out so that we can savor the sweetness of being insiders is a reduction of reality, a shrinkage of life.

Nowhere is this price more terrible than when it is paid in the cause of religion. But religion has a long history of doing just that, of reducing the huge mysteries of God to the respectability of club rules, of shrinking the vast human community to a "membership." But with God there are no outsiders.

Luke is a most vigorous champion of the outsider. An outsider himself, the only Gentile in an all-Jewish cast of New Testament writers; he shows how Jesus includes those who typically were treated as outsiders by the religious establishment of the day: women, common laborers (sheepherders), the racially different (Samaritans), the poor. He will not countenance religion as a club. As Luke tells the story, all of us who have found ourselves on the outside looking in on life with no hope of gaining entrance (and who of us hasn't felt it?) now find the doors wide open, found and welcomed by God in Jesus.

---

In Luke, we read- When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

Come home for Christmas - physically, if able, and through your thoughts and prayers, if at a distance. Let us welcome one another with open arms as we worship together.



# Fairhaven Community Volunteer Service Group Newsletter November 15, 2021

Due to pandemic, the meeting was held at Emmanuel UCC (Mud Church) 13898 Township Rd. 127, Upper Sandusky, OH. Vice President Arlene Main called the meeting to order.

Devotions were given by Bucyrus St. John's.

Roll Call: Volunteers – 12, Staff – 2.

Minutes were approved as read.

A Thank You was received from Kara Orions for the catheter bag covers made by several of the volunteers. Becky also expressed a Thank You to Dorothy for the Halloween cards she made plus a Thank You to Brenda for the activity supplies furnished.

#### **VSG Business:**

On Monday, November 22<sup>nd</sup> Volunteers will be allowed inside Fairhaven to do the decorations of two trees (the one at reception and the one in the chapel). Following the decorating, the dedication of the Tree of Love will take place at which time a list of all those who donated and for whom will be read. The dedication will be broadcast over the Fairhaven channel to the rooms of all residents. Also, a short video will be on Facebook. Those who donated to the Tree of Love will be notified of the Facebook video. All volunteers who enter the building will need to wear a mask. The cleaning of the Gift Shop will be done by the Fairhaven staff, after which the Gift Shop volunteers will go through supplies with the hope to open again after the first of the year. The Donation Request letter was reviewed and a few changes were suggested. Toward the end of the month of November, the revised letter will be sent out to the standard newsletter mailing list with the request that the churches send the letter out with their monthly newsletter in December and also announce to their congregations.

It was announced that all officers agreed to serve another year in their current capacity. Installation of officers for 2022 will take place at December meeting. At the December meeting, the stuffing of the stockings for the residents will take place. Arlene will make the stockings and Dorothy will purchase the supplies for "stuffing."

It was determined about 105 stockings are needed. Will meet at 10 to do the stockings and hold the meeting after.

Those volunteers who wish to do so will plan on meeting at Fairhaven on January 3<sup>rd</sup> to undecorate the trees unless otherwise informed by Jean Smith.

There will be no meeting in January.

The activity booklet for 2022 will be set up as done for the prior year. Will continue with listing the volunteers at end of book in alphabetical order with church affiliation listed.

#### **Staff:**

Jean Smith reported that 97% for the residents are vaccinated and 30% plus of the staff are also; therefore, masks are still required. They did booster shots last Friday for all who qualified and were interested and will do another in December. N95 masks are needed to protect others.

Jess Moss received the scholarship from the Volunteer Service Group and is working on going from LPN to RN.

Also, Upper Sandusky does a Festival of Trees and Fairhaven is involved. United Church Homes manages The Villa at Shariden in Carey which are rental units of age 55 and older. These where described as very nice units. She also shared that 63% of employees participated in the giving campaign this year. A new development is that United Church Homes will do a major renovation or construct a new building for Fairhaven. As of last Wednesday a pause has been done on admissions. They are now at 106 and expect through natural attrition will be down to 99 occupants as of the first of the year. Fairhaven will become a 99 bed facility due to the fact that because of government regulations, more support is received from the government for a facility of less than 100 beds. Face to face visitation is allowed but must call and make a reservation to do so. Jean Smith also stated that they could use physical help on putting up the outside decorations and also donation of more lights. If anyone would be so inclined and capable, please contact Fairhaven.

Becky shared tips to help keep oneself calm during the current times. The meeting was closed with "The Way".

The next regular meeting will be held December 20<sup>th</sup> at 10am for stocking stuffing. Devotions will be by Upper Emmanuel. Pizza will be furnished for lunch. The meeting will be held at Upper Emmanuel unless informed differently.

Dear Friends of Fairhaven,

As you are all aware, the Fairhaven Volunteer Service Group has always held several fund raisers throughout the year, the main one being the Harvest Fest. Due to the pandemic we were unable to hold this fundraiser in 2020, or any of the others, and instead just requested donations to be able to continue the work we do with Fairhaven.

In 2019 when we held the Harvest Fest we collected a total of \$4,620.33 from that one event with which we were able to donate \$4,000.00 to resident's specialized programs, art and craft supplies and new curtain and blinds. And due to knowing our funds for 2020 were going to be limited due to also not being able to hold bake sales or any other fund raisers at Fairhaven, we reduced our Scholarship Fund the following spring from \$1,000.00 to \$500.00.

From donations, which was the only fund raising we did in 2020, we were able to collect \$3,460.00 with which we managed to donate \$3,500.00 for retractable awning and patio umbrellas for Reflection Ridge. Now, once again due to our limited ability to have "normal" fund raisers, only gave \$500.00 this year to the Scholarship Fund. We thought the pandemic was easing and we were lining up alternative fund raisers for 2021. However, nothing has let up and due to not being able to be in the Fairhaven premises, our fund raising ability for 2021 has been zero. However, the needs of the residents have not dissipated.

I believe most of us are in a much better position than the residents at Fairhaven as they try to contend with the restrictions forced on them by the covid pandemic. Although the restrictions and regulations change, the pandemic continues to restrict many activities and the needs of the residents continue to grow.

Therefore, we are once again asking you to look deep into your heart and equally deep into your pocketbook and give what you can, plus maybe just a little bit more, so our group can continue to support the Fairhaven residents. Everything we collect will be passed on by the Volunteer Service Group to help the residents of Fairhaven.

# PAT'S CHOCOLATE CARAMEL BARS

Bottom:

1 pkg. German chocolate cake mix

3/4 cup melted butter

1/3 cup evaporated milk

1 cup chopped nuts

Combine by hand and pat 1/2 mixture into greased and floured 9x13" pan. Bake 8 min. at 350 degrees. Melt together 1 pkg. Kraft caramels and 1/2 cup evaporated milk in double boiler. Pour over baked mixture and cover with 1 6oz pkg. chocolate chips. Top with remaining cake mixture by crumbling with fingers. Bake 18 min. at 350 degrees.
